Yes, it looks like we will have to move into full fighting mode about the Metro tunnel works in South Kensington. We have demanded soil toxicity data by mid-week. Remember the area was a decades-old dump. We want to know what's in the dirt that will be coming out (thousands of tonnes of it being dug up and driven through our streets) and what measures will be taken to protect us and our kids from the poisons that are stirred up.

## Metro Tunnel impact on Kensington approaches boiling point

After months of talks with representatives of the Metro Tunnel project the Kensington Association and local residents have made progress on a number of key issues, but major areas of disagreement still exist. We want a comprehensive agreement over management of tunnel works and final outcomes.

- If site and hazard management is as good as the constructors say it will be, why won't they agree to a comprehensive regime of sound, vibration and air quality monitoring and real time public reporting? At the time of writing, the Cross Yarra Partnership (CYP) -- responsible for digging the tunnel and building a large, 3 storey services "bunker" next to South Kensington -- categorically rejected allowing residents access to real time monitoring and is requiring residents with concerns to lodge a formal complaint and then await a profoundly opaque process of review.
- We have demanded the release of soil and ground water toxicity testing. This is
  pivotal to risk and site management as the equivalent of 5,000 large dump trucks will
  be required to remove excavated soil.
   In an act of high farce, our request to see the full 140 report on testing (or at least the
  executive summary) saw resident reps instead provided with 2 pages of cut and
  pasted text an hour before the negotiations!
- In a good win, the CYP has agreed to pay for dilapidation studies for all houses near South Kensington station. Such studies provide the basis for compensation (and legal action) if homes are damaged by construction works.
- But the criteria for relocation of residents effected by construction remains deplorable.
- And, in terms of the legacy, we do not have agreement on an integrated design approach for the works.
